Implementation Status of County Pharmaceutical Stewardship Ordinances

Pharmaceutical manufacturers are financing and coordinating secure medicine return programs in 2 counties in Washington State and 6 counties in California that have enacted local pharmaceutical stewardship ordinances. More county-wide programs will launch soon under these local laws.

MED-Project LLC is the stewardship organization operating the take-back programs on behalf of roughly 400 pharmaceutical manufacturers. These ordinances allow pharmacies, hospitals, and law enforcement agencies to join the programs over time, therefore the number of drop box locations may increase.

	Santa Clara 1.92 million	County expects to transition existing medicine drop boxes at ~ 40 locations to MED- Project operations during 2017, beginning in August. Prepaid mailers available to homebound residents.
	Santa Cruz 275,000	MED-Project is directly providing or compensating the county for either drop boxes or mailers at pharmacies and police stations: 24 sites for medicines and sharps, 12 sites for medicines only, 13 sites for sharps only, including 3 public kiosks.
	San Francisco, City and County 850,000	33 secure medicine drop boxes at 21 pharmacies and 12 police stations. Prepaid mailers available at all libraries, and other sites like YMCAs and schools.
	San Mateo 760,000	35 secure medicine drop boxes at 13 pharmacies and 22 police stations. Prepaid mailers available upon request and from all libraries.
ž	Rockland 327,000	Stewardship plan in development. Plan must include secure medicine drop boxes or prepaid return mailers are every retail pharmacy chain with 3 or more stores.
Washington	King 2.2 million	99 secure medicine drop boxes at 75 pharmacies and 24 police stations. Prepaid mailers for medicines available at county library locations and some town halls.
	Snohomish 780,000	31 secure medicine drop boxes at 18 pharmacies and 13 police stations. Prepaid mailers available upon request to homebound residents.
	Kitsap 260,000	Stewardship plan was due in June 2017 and is under review. Plan must include drop boxes and mail-back services.
	Pierce 845,000	Stewardship plan was due in June 2017 and is under review. Plan must include drop boxes and mail-back services.
